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Career Exploration

Conscientiously exploring career options can help you make better short-term decisions, and help you develop a career plan that includes professional growth in a field you enjoy.

This workshop introduces a career exploration process that can be used whenever you find yourself at a career crossroads. First, you'll analyze what you're uniquely suited to bring to a job. Then based on what you've identified as your interests, work values and skills, you'll identify occupational areas that might be a good fit. Finally, you'll learn about market demand and potential job growth for the occupations you're considering.

3 Components of Career Exploration

A productive exploration begins with you. It's important to take stock of your interests, your values and your skills when you're considering work options.

Interests

By thinking about what you like to do and what truly interests you, you'll get a better idea about which career paths to target.

Work Values

Values are those guiding principles that are important to us. Clarifying your work values will help you identify the type of work environment where you can be happy and successful.



Skills

Whether you're beginning your career or have been in the job market for years, it's helpful to take a look at the things you do well.

Dear Career Seeker,

While many factors affect your career choices, developing these five competencies will help you become a more competent career explorer.

Self Awareness includes knowing your interests, values, and lifestyle and understanding what those mean in the workplace.

Continuous learning helps you negotiate change as well as discover opportunity.

Developing a future focus prepares you to assess employment trends and needs, and their potential affect on you.

Building Connections to other professionals and developing a network of contacts provides a resource for collaboration and support when you need it.

Flexibility is key to career problem-solving. It helps you adapt to situations you can't control, and follow interesting opportunities. It may even help you reframe past experience in a new light.

The Career Exploration Workshop introduces methods to foster these competencies. We hope they will be valuable to you any time you're making career decisions.

Holland Code Interest Clusters

Developed by vocational psychologist John Holland, *Holland Codes* have become a widely used method for matching interest clusters to job categories. By considering what you like to do, identify the three interest clusters that sound

Realistic

You prefer practical, hands-on problems. You enjoy dealing with plants, animals and real-world materials, like wood, tools and machinery. You enjoy outside work and tend not to like jobs that involve paperwork or working closely with others.

Enterprising

You like activities that have to do with starting up and carrying out projects, especially business ventures. You like persuading and leading people, making decisions and taking risks for profit. You tend to prefer action to thought.

You prefer work that deals with form, design and patterns. Self-expression in your work is important to you and you like settings where work can be done without following a clear set of rules.

Investigative

Artistic

You like work activities that have to do with ideas and thinking more than with physical activity. You like searching for facts and to figure out problems mentally rather than to persuade or lead people.

Conventional

You prefer to follow procedures and routines. You like working with data and detail. You like your work to be guided by precise standards rather than your judgment and prefer working where there are clear lines of authority.



Social
